- Essays will be judged on creativity and originality of content, grammatical accuracy, logic and clarity.
- Only one entry per student.
- The top three winning essays for each school will be submitted by the Principal for countywide consideration.
- All school-based winners will be invited to attend the Best & Brightest Awards Ceremony on **Wednesday, May 17, 2023**, where final winners will be announced and prizes awarded.
