HISTORY OF BEST & BRIGHTEST

Eighteen years ago, a group of community leaders worked together to bring to life an idea conceived by Ron Sachs: to honor and recognize some of Leon County's top high school seniors with scholarships for their work in diverse academic and leadership categories. But a key difference from other scholarships was the overarching focus on students who have demonstrated a genuine heart and commitment for service.

And so it began, in 2006, The Best & Brightest Awards — reflecting a positive partnership among Leon County Schools, Leon County Schools Foundation (during the first year), World Class Schools of Leon County, the Tallahassee Democrat, Envision Credit Union and Sachs Media Group.

In that first year of The Best & Brightest Awards, 81 students were selected for such high honors as school-based winners from the public and private high schools in Leon County. Major scholarships were then awarded in each of 15 categories in countywide finals, \$500 Winner, \$250 Runner-up, and \$100 Honorable Mention. Then, and in every year since, the students are evaluated on their academic record of excellence, school and community service and leadership. They also demonstrate personal interview effectiveness with a panel of three community leaders who serve as judges in each of the 15 categories. Through our sponsors' continued support, the scholarships have significantly grown: \$1,500 Winner; \$750 Runner-up; \$500 Honorable Mention — and \$100 for all other school-based winners.

In 2011, we added an annual 8th Grade Essay contest — to reach down to the middle schools and to encourage a culture of service among those students who have been learning about

civics and forming their ultimate interests. Public and private schools select their top three essays to compete for the countywide recognition, with scholarships of \$500 Winner, \$250 Runner-up and \$100 Honorable Mention.

A total of more than \$931,800 has been awarded to 2,579 seniors, 596 eighth graders and to the schools during these 18 years. We are proud to celebrate The Best & Brightest Awards by inspiring young people in our community to strive for academic excellence — but to also place a priority on service to others as an ethic to be embraced for life. Every year, the stories, examples and achievements of these outstanding senior high school student leaders inspire their peers and younger students to reach higher — and comfort all of us about the future of our community, state, country and world being entrusted to such fine human beings.

Jessie Powell takes art to the next level as she lets it be the drive behind everything she does. Whether it's spearheading a service class at her school, winning countless awards for her art, or designing graphics and t-shirts for various clubs and events, Powell exemplifies what it means to be the best and brightest. Her dedication and passion toward service have allowed her to delve even deeper into her art.

Not only does Powell excel in her art, she also has shown a commitment to leave Chiles High School a better place than when she found it. Powell, ardent about service, recruited enough students to have her school establish the Engaged Citizen and Service Learning Class into the curriculum. While in that class. she was able to create an environment to give back to the community and spread her passion for service throughout the school. The class focused on researching local nonprofits and learning their history, then sewing items to help them and their beneficiaries. They completed projects such as sewing bibs for children at Gretchen Everhart School, guilts for elderly Meals on Wheels recipients, and Port Pillows for cancer patients at Tallahassee Memorial Hospital. "The most important thing I learned while enrolled in this class was the necessity of staying attentive to issues within my community, and the importance of peer collaboration and expression of individual creativity," said Powell. The class had such a substantial success rate, the administration agreed to create a second level of the class for students to continue through the program. Powell herself contributed over 90 hours of service in and out of the classroom while in this program.

In addition to initiating and ensuring the lasting impact of service on her campus, Powell has received countless awards and accolades for her inspiring art. She placed in various art shows, including two-time recognition as a Mahaska Whitley Student Exhibition General Award Winner and a 2023 Florida State Fair Wall of Excellence Winner. She also was awarded the Fine Arts Department Award for Outstanding AP.

Powell has had a deep impact on her school, our Tallahassee community, and the people around her. "Jessie is a natural leader," said teacher Sandie Hanna. "She has a sense of community that recognizes that we are all some part of a 'larger whole.' Her peers see this in her and it inspires them; she is one of a kind." Her incorporation of art and service is inspiring. Whether she is designing her senior class shirt, sewing masks for workers at TMH during COVID-19, or placing in over eight art shows across Florida, Powell has left her mark on this community.





Racking up over 190 service hours, Citlali Patino has demonstrated a clear passion for service, and they let it drive all they do. From volunteering at the library, to being a volunteer summer art camp counselor, to assisting in the production of the Henry Box Brown Production, Patino is actively working to leave their mark on our community.

Patino is an active member in Leon High School's Marching Redcoats Band, serving as flute section leader and acquiring a superior rating at both the district and state levels for their Solo and Ensemble flute choir performance. Further, they are a distinguished member of Model United Nations, taking home the Distinguished Delegation Award and placing in the top five for best paper for General Assembly.

Whether it's being Art Club President, National Art Honor Society Vice President, or runner-up in the Tallahassee Winter Festival Youth Fine Art Competition, Patino does it all. Their dedication to their art and the thirst that drives them as an artist has led to two of their original works being published in the Leon High School Mosaic Magazine. Patino's drive to leave an impact on the Tallahassee community is apparent and inspiring. "I hope to be a comforting presence to others," said Patino. "I had people I could look up to, and I'd like to be that person for others like me."

If you look up "best and brightest" in the dictionary, you might see a picture of Florida High athlete Jay Beachum. From her outstanding statistics in her time playing softball to her dedication to the community, Beachum is an all-around outstanding student-athlete.

Beachum moved to Tallahassee from South Carolina two years ago after she committed to play D1 Women's Softball at Florida State University. In the two years since the move, she has had more of an impact on this community than many have in their entire lives. Through her high school years, she has volunteered at places such as the Boys and Girls Club, The Ark (an affordable housing service for homeless or displaced adults), the Leon County Public Library, and Pet Alliance. But, she says, the one that had the most impact on her was her time volunteering with the Florida Department of Corrections. "I know that getting an education is of paramount importance," said Beachum, "but helping someone else achieve their educational goals to brighten their future has forever changed my life." Beachum's dedication to her work with the Department of Corrections did not go unnoticed. Melvin Herring, Assistant Chief of Education at the agency's Central Office, said, "Jaysoni has been a model of consistency and hard work while volunteering with the Florida Department of Corrections, [she] has embodied our mission statement of inspiring success by transferring one life at a time."

While accumulating over 115 service hours, Beachum still held her dedication to softball

at the center of what she does. Beachum has been varsity lettering in softball since sixth grade, and once she entered high school she immediately became a star. She has racked up over 15 athletic awards including Big Bend Player of the Year and the 2021 Alabama 3A All-State Hitter of the Year. In addition to those accolades, Beachum was also a part of the 2022 All-Big Bend Softball First Team and was a USA All American player.

Through all that she has done, Beachum, to her core, has exemplified what it means to be a good student, person, and leader. When asked about what she wants to be remembered for, she responded, "I not only want to be remembered for my athletic ability, but for my character too." Beachum's legacy in this community will without question be a strong one.

One sport wasn't enough for Wyatt Townsend. While attending Chiles High School, Townsend spent four years on the varsity teams of three sports: swim & dive, track & field, and cross country. This commitment to athletics led him to be a state qualifier for cross country in all four years of high school, but also helped him place in the top ten at the FHSAA 4A Track and Field State Championship in the 3200m. He was the captain of both the Chiles cross country and track & field teams, where he broke the school record in the 4x1600m relay with a final time of 18:25. Outside of athletics, Townsend has amassed over 570 service hours. Resavage spent some 100 hours over two years creating and executing The Big Event Jr., and says, "I have learned the importance of effective language arts, the power of volunteerism, but most importantly, that service is a gift." She was the creator and instigator of the inaugural event in 2022 and continues to serve as chairman for the 2023 event as it expands beyond Leon High School to include other local schools as well. In addition to these two roles, Resavage serves as president of the Interact Service Club.

Resavage is also an active member of Global Philanthropy Leaders, a non-profit program that introduces students to an

organization that facilitates microloans for struggling entrepreneurs across the globe. In her two years participating in the program, Resavage has provided 10 loans to individuals in nine different countries, donating money she makes at a part-time job. Resavage continues to expand her global impact with her service mission experience in Ecuador. Once back in the U.S., she continued to be an advocate for the program, presenting and sharing her experience with large groups.



Over the course of his tennis career, he was a state doubles quarter-finalist and a district singles and doubles champion. He was also named All Big-Bend Honorable Mention and was a finalist at the "A New Beginning" tennis tournament.

Alex's most meaningful involvement was his participation in the Youth Health Leadership (YHL) program sponsored by FSU. During his time in YHL, he served as chair of the community leadership board and currently serves as an ambassador. Whether from volunteering thousands of hours of her time or placing in national competitions for her expertise in technology, Sruthi Sentil will leave a lasting impact wherever she goes.

Of her many accomplishments to date, perhaps the Rickards High School student's biggest was her creation of BuddyKnit, a nonprofit peer relationship organization Sentil started while virtually tutoring seven students in the foster care system. Through her experience as a tutor, she came to empathize with her students and understand the disparities that plague the Tallahassee community. She saw a lack of opportunity for people her age to make an impact because of age requirements for mentorship. BuddyKnit establishes long-term peer relationships joining high school and college-age volunteers with lower-income youth in a way that creates long-term, reliable, and relatable support for these youths. Currently, BuddyKnit has over 200 volunteers and students with 80 active one year or longer matches in Pensacola, Leon, and Gadsden counties. The organization has also created robotics clubs across Title 1 partners, establishing in-school maker spaces for students. Sentil's goal is to expand BuddyKnit to the entire state of Florida. "BuddyKnit remains the shining star of my legacy, with the foundation I built seeping deep into the Florida community," said Sentil. "By promoting more active and personable forms of giveback, my work has helped break societally placed boundaries, building a connected and

empathetic community of upliftment. Values instilled at a young age are carried throughout each volunteer and impacted child's lifetime."

Sentil's dedication to service has not gone unnoticed. She was honored this year as one of Tallahassee's Five Young Women to Watch by the Tallahassee Democrat. Additionally, she has won multiple state Science and Engineering Fair Awards for her work in Intelligent Machines and Robotics. She was also recognized with the Regeneron Science Talent Search Scholar Award and the National Center for Women in Informatics and Technology National Award. Sentil has been awarded over \$8,000 in grants to go toward her work with BuddyKnit.

Aside from her nonprofit passions, Sentil was involved in the teen board of the Junior League of Tallahassee and served as a regional affiliate for the NCWIT Aspirations in Computing. At Rickards, she serves as the Key Club webmaster and volunteers at Fairfield Middle School, where she founded an annual mini-mu math competition. A National Merit Finalist, Sentil is also co-chair of the Leon County Schools Student District Advisory Council. Her positive impact has been felt – and recognized -- by both the Tallahassee and Rickards communities.


