HISTORY OF BEST & BRIGHTEST

Nineteen years ago, a group of community leaders worked together to bring to life an idea conceived by Ron Sachs: to honor and recognize some of Leon County's top high school seniors with scholarships for their work in diverse academic and leadership categories. But a key difference from other scholarships was the overarching focus on students who have demonstrated a genuine heart and commitment for service.

And so it began, in 2006, The Best & Brightest Awards — reflecting a positive partnership among Leon County Schools, Leon County Schools Foundation (during the first year), World Class Schools of Leon County, the Tallahassee Democrat, Envision Credit Union and Sachs Media Group.

In that first year of The Best & Brightest Awards, 81 students were selected for such high honors as school-based winners from the public and private high schools in Leon County. Major scholarships were then awarded in each of 15 categories in countywide finals, \$500 Winner, \$250 Runner-up, and \$100 Honorable Mention. Then, and in every year since, the students are evaluated on their academic record of excellence, school and community service and leadership. They also demonstrate personal interview effectiveness with a panel of three community leaders who serve as judges in each of the 15 categories. Through our sponsors' continued support, the scholarships have significantly grown: \$1,500 Winner; \$750 Runner-up; \$500 Honorable Mention — and \$100 for all other school-based winners.

In 2011, we added an annual 8th Grade Essay contest — to reach down to the middle schools and to encourage a culture of service among those students who have been learning about

civics and forming their ultimate interests. Public and private schools select their top three essays to compete for the countywide recognition, with scholarships of \$500 Winner, \$250 Runner-up and \$100 Honorable Mention.

A total of more than \$986,000 has been awarded to 2713 Seniors, 655 eighth graders and to the schools during these 19 years. We are proud to celebrate The Best & Brightest Awards by inspiring young people in our community to strive for academic excellence — but to also place a priority on service to others as an ethic to be embraced for life. Every year, the stories, examples and achievements of these outstanding senior high school student leaders inspire their peers and younger students to reach higher — and comfort all of us about the future of our community, state, country and world being entrusted to such fine human beings.

Unwavering in the face of adversity, Leon High School senior Liana Rieger has harnessed her struggles to acclimate to changing environments as her parents have relocated across the United States and Europe to pursue their musical passions and used them to fuel her ever-growing passion for art. The intangible connections she has formed with people along the way have helped drive her artistic endeavors.

In addition to her art education at Leon through courses such as AP 2D Art and Design and AP Drawing, she continued to seek opportunities to broaden her artistic views in high-level institutions such as the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts' pre-college Summer Academy where she has taken several Art Education courses. It was during her time at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts that she discovered her love for illustration and concept art which greatly expanded the ideas inspiring her art. These inspirations laid the foundation for a collaborative fantasy-dystopian novel project titled Islands of Crimson she has written almost entirely in a virtual environment with one of her close friends. Liana's most recent art pieces were heavily inspired by themes such as hypocrisies within religious organizations present in her book. Her art simultaneously brings its viewers into Liana's own world as well as the world she has created in her literary work.

Liana's talent has been celebrated through exhibitions of her work in PAFA's Fisher Brooks Gallery, Lemoyne Arts' Mahaska Whitley Student Exhibition (2023), and two features in Leon High School's Mosaic Magazine (2023). She was also awarded the Thomas Eakins Emerging Artist Scholarship for the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts' pre-college Summer Academy Program (2022).

While recognized for her undeniable artistic excellence, Liana has made a notable impact on her community through her work at the Lafayette Arts & Crafts Center where she has volunteered 39 hours as a teacher's assistant for youth painting and drawing classes. Her most impactful work, however, was the 83 hours she spent painting sets, working as a spotlight operator, and a general technician for Leon High School's production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat." Through these roles, Liana was able to showcase and share her appreciation for the arts with her community.

Despite her extensive commitment to volunteer work and her relentless pursuit of her artistic passions, Liana still made time to excel in her academics, making the Honor Roll each year. "Liana is a gifted artist, an excellent student, and an amazing young person," remarks her art teacher. When asked what legacy she hopes to leave Liana shares "I sincerely believe that the stories I have told through my artwork will encourage both those who are artistically driven and those who are not to unashamedly pursue their individual interests with passion and joy." Liana's impact on the Tallahassee community will certainly be an enduring one.

Over her four years at FSUS, she has amassed over 264 volunteer hours through her work cleaning up Tom Brown Park through FSUS' Environmental Club which she is a part of in addition to her volunteer work with eight other clubs she is a member of. Her passion for helping others stems from her most impactful community service working as a Counselor in Training for FSUS Summer Camp. "This involvement was not just a summer job; it became a part of my personal growth journey, teaching me the importance of slowing down and connecting with people," she says. The connections she has forged with the community through her service and her art will prove to have a lasting impact.



PATRICK KOONLeon High School





KEVIN WANGRickards High School




Transformative is the word Rickards High School's Kevin Wang used to describe his high school experience. In following his academic passions with a business-minded finesse, Wang has transformed the once modest Rickards Science Olympiad Invitational and grown it to one operating on a national scale. He worked not only to code a website for the event from scratch but was able to garner over \$3500 in sponsorships to give away as awards to the top competitors. One director position, however, wasn't enough for Kevin. He also held the position of Co-Director of Rickards Mu Alpha Theta Invitational, a mathematics honors society for high school students. where he was responsible for coordinating the logistics of the in-person event, expanding out-of-state participation, and managing 10k in organizational finances. Outside school, Kevin continued to foster his evident entrepreneurial spirit by starting his own paddle business where he created and printed his model on a 3D printer and sold them to swimmers across the nation.

A natural-born leader, Kevin exemplifies his extraordinary talents in his leadership roles in not one but five different clubs at Rickards. As the President of Rickards Science Olympiad, he is responsible for the organization of six teams and over 70 members and has won a total of nine awards at the state and national level. He shares his wealth of knowledge with his peers in his roles as the President of Rickards Speech and Debate Club, Co-Founder of Rickards Future Business Leaders of America, and Statistics Captain. Mathlete

and athlete, Kevin is also the Captain of the Swim Team where he has been a FHSAA State Championship Finalist six times.

While Kevin's passion for STEM shines through in his leadership roles, it is through his volunteer work that he can share that passion with others. Having amassed over 1,000 volunteer hours, has demonstrated to his community just how exciting math and science can be. Through his roles as Director of the Science Olympiad Invitational and Co-Director of the Mu Alpha Theta Invitational, he brought STEM to the forefront of the Leon County community. Kevin has also used his education to educate others in his role at a non-profit makerspace called Making Awesome where he fixes 3D printers and teaches others how to use them. He has also worked with middle school students and high school students alike in accelerating their understanding of mathematics and computer science.

When asked about what legacy he hopes to leave Kevin shares that he hopes that he will "continue every year to inspire students nationwide to fall in love with STEM." Kevin has not only inspired students, but he has motivated them to succeed.



In the 6th grade, he began sharing his findings yearly at the Science Fair. During his first year of high school, he began a three-year research project on Lung Cancer Metastasis and CRISPRa/i that would make him a two-time finalist at the International Science and Engineering Fair Finalist and invited him to present at conferences across the country. Already a scientist in his own right, Shiv continued his scientific research at Florida State University's Department of Psychology Lab after his acceptance into their Young Scholar's Program. Here, he conducted research in a language production laboratory to study the effect of cadence and binary predictive factors on speech models for autism therapy which he presented at the FSU Research Exposition.

Using his scientific knowledge in service of his community, Shiv spent the summer after his sophomore year, working towards his Certified Clinical Medical Assistant Certification and completing relevant coursework and volunteer work through FSU's SSTRIDE Summer Medical Institute. Volunteering at a local primary care clinic and cancer center, Shiv has seen over 1000 patients completing tasks such as triaging patients, taking vitals, performing lab tests, administering injections, and performing

phlebotomies. Through these roles treating patients from medically underserved towns, Shiv has witnessed first-hand the impact rural healthcare disparities have had on his community. Guided by an empathetic heart he aims to be a leader within his community to help close this gap in healthcare access.

Serving on the board of directors of Big Bend Cares & CarePoint, Shiv workshops legislation policies to provide needed coverage to the marginalized HIV/AIDS Community in Tallahassee. As chair of Youth Health Leadership, he engages in outreach to minority youth in Leon County explaining the dangers of sedentary lifestyles. As a board member of WFSU's Healthcare Jobs Explained he inspires the next generation of healthcare professionals to dream big and do bigger the way he has.

When asked what legacy he hopes to leave Shive shares "I wish to inspire through demonstration and service, showing the empathy and connection possible within health-science." As a research assistant for the Wang Lab at Florida State University, Sarayu uncovered a mechanism that can advance future drug development and cancer therapy. Her findings were published in a paper indexed in PubMed and presented at the International Conferences on Advances in Medical Engineering and Applications where she was awarded "Best Presentation Distinction." Sarayu has also conducted research at prestigious universities such as Carnegie Mellon, the University of Pennsylvania, and the Mag Lab.

Applying her knowledge to service, Sarayu was a member of Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare's Teen Volunteer Program. Through her volunteer work at TMH and the Tallahassee Gastro Clinic, she has spent over 200 hours shadowing and assisting healthcare professionals. With a desire to combine her passion for healthcare and service, she continues to give back to her community through her role as the Co-President of Rickards' Red Cross Youth Chapter. Immigrating from India at a young age, Velan never took his education for granted and understood the potential it provided him to address the needs of his community. Dedicating countless hours of his free time to research, Velan was able to harness that potential. After being retained for his exceptional performance as a participant in the Tallahassee Future Leaders Academy program, he began coauthoring a paper that utilizes Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services data to assess the impact of community mental health services on substance abuse. This is just one piece of a broader research project on how the pandemicinfluenced service delivery and healthcare disparities. Velan has also spearheaded research in developing a tool to improve social living conditions through evaluation of environmental impact categorization in collaboration with professors at FSU and FAMU. A paper detailing his research findings will be published this spring with the impact of his findings extending across business, agriculture, and human health.

JAMES ZHANG Chiles High School



Chiles High School's James Zhang, a strong proponent of the principle that change begins from the ground up, is helping lay a solid foundation for the ongoing fight for responsible technological development. After witnessing the sheriff's flawed predictive policing algorithm mistakenly target his childhood best friend, James knew he had to speak out. Despite his efforts testifying at city council and school board meetings, the program continued to receive funding. Fueled by his pursuit of justice, he began educating his community about the danger of predictive policing and equipping them with the tools to speak out against it. James led a FOIA open records request campaign alongside a group of litigators and drafted a bill to regulate police surveillance technology that resulted in the program's discontinuance. His efforts in his own community connected him to Encode Justice, a global coalition of group activists fighting for human rights in the age of Al. In partnership with the organization, James founded the Florida Chapter.

James' profound knowledge of technology has been a powerful weapon of change within his community. He has continued to expand his knowledge through programs such as Yale's Young Global Scholar Program (Innovations in Science & Technology Cohort, MIT's Beaver Works Summer Institute, and his selection as 1 of 95 students to participate in NASA's SEES Internship Program. Through this program, James used machine learning to project the mass loss of polar ice sheets and global sea level change over the next 100 years

and presented and published his findings for the American Geophysical Union Conference. He has received countless recognitions for his technical skills including his selection as the US Congressional App Challenge winner for an app he created with his friends that helps non-English speakers and mentally challenged individuals to practice English vocabulary.

In addition to his pursuit of knowledge and advocacy in his community, James maintains several leadership roles within his school community. As the President of Key Club, he organized sandbag filling days before the impacts of Hurricanes Ian and Idalia. As Chess Club Tournament Director, James has directed official USCF-rated tournaments and founded his school's first chess team. Continuing his initiative to advocate for the underserved, he represents 33,000 students as a Leon County School Board Student Member. He has leveraged his position to help provide STEM resources to students in Title I schools.

When reflecting on his time at Chiles, James shares "I fought for what I believed in. I wasn't afraid to speak my mind, have a good laugh, and give from the heart." We could all learn a thing or two from James.


